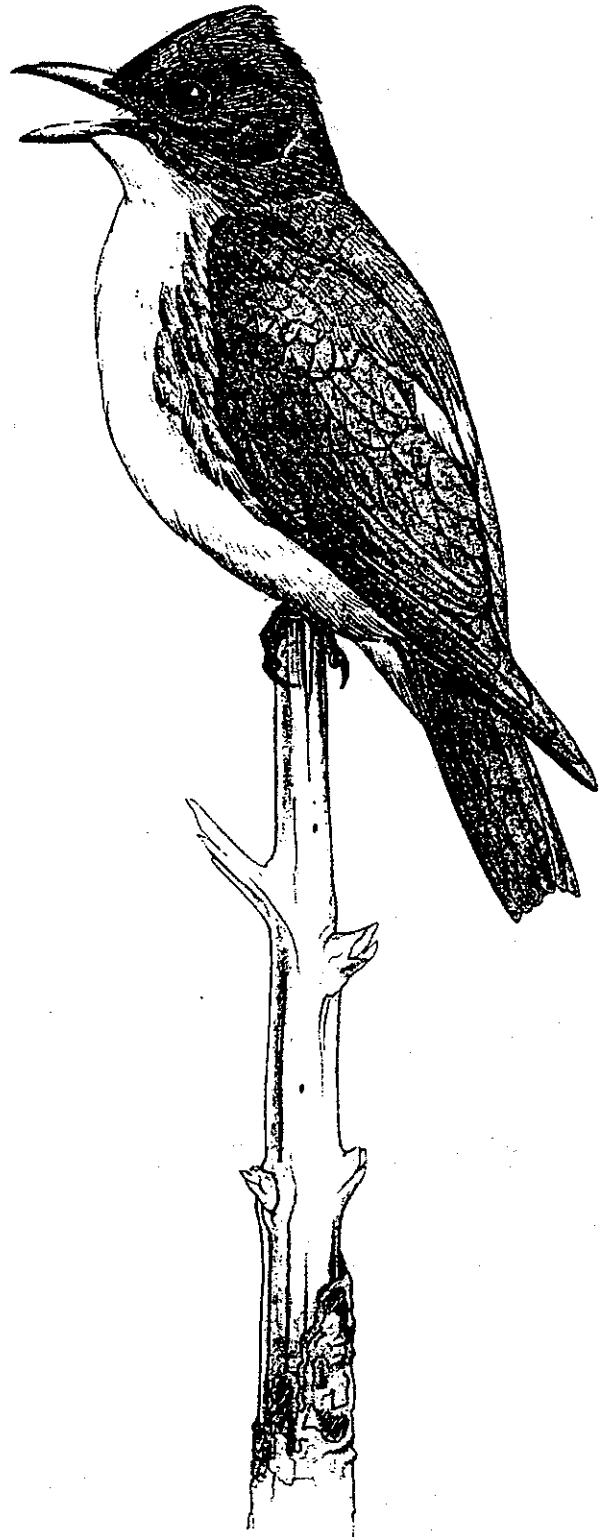


**Activity Checklist**

**Wildlife Tree Scavenger Hunt**

Find evidence of wildlife trees, signs of animal and plants that use wildlife trees, and other features. Remember: **do not disturb anything!**

- \_\_\_\_\_ A cavity that might be in use
- \_\_\_\_\_ A good place for a bat to roost
- \_\_\_\_\_ A nest of some sort
- \_\_\_\_\_ Woody debris
- \_\_\_\_\_ A hunting perch
- \_\_\_\_\_ A wildlife tree with its top broken off
- \_\_\_\_\_ Insects that could be food for birds
- \_\_\_\_\_ A deciduous wildlife tree
- \_\_\_\_\_ Woodpecker holes
- \_\_\_\_\_ A hollow trunk where a bear could sleep
- \_\_\_\_\_ A wildlife tree in a dry, sunny forest
- \_\_\_\_\_ Fungi
- \_\_\_\_\_ The sounds of a woodpecker drilling into a tree
- \_\_\_\_\_ A coniferous wildlife tree
- \_\_\_\_\_ Owl pellets
- \_\_\_\_\_ Lichens
- \_\_\_\_\_ A wildlife tree in a wet forest
- \_\_\_\_\_ A standing wildlife tree
- \_\_\_\_\_ Moss growing on a log
- \_\_\_\_\_ Animals using a tree
- \_\_\_\_\_ Squirrel middens
